Feeding Program

We offer an interdisciplinary approach to the assessment and treatment of feeding and swallowing disorders. Assessments are conducted by an Occupational Therapist and/or Speech Language Pathologist to assess skills across the full continuum of the feeding process, including the sensory, oral motor and swallowing components. When needed, we also have the ability to incorporate Physical Therapists to assist in appropriate positioning, seating options, and strength/stability required for successful feeding. Our therapists utilize a variety of approaches to asses and treat each unique child in order to safely meet nutritional needs for growth and development and optimize their participation with feeding, and family mealtimes.
